- 1. Welcome:** Billy Bob welcomed the group.
- 2. Monthly Staff Report:** Erin Davis presented the monthly staff report. The 5 categories in the strategic prevention framework seem to be more equal this past month due to the decrease in prevention activities because of the the COVID 19 pandemic. (Evaluation, Assessment, Implementation, Capacity and planning). JM4C has received some funding through Rock County Human Services and plan to purchase ID scanners to loan to the licensed establishments during special events. Erin is planning a cultural competency coalition training with Santo Carfora for this summer/fall.
- 3. Vaping Logic Model and Action plan:** Those coalition members who attended the Coalition boot camp this year have finished the vaping action plan and logic model. The action plan and logic model was reviewed. Jane is asking for more input from the group on how to provide support and reduce access/ barriers on the promotion of e-cigarettes in stores. Jane will send the action plan out to all coalition members and please submit your ideas to her. The team is also asking for ideas on how to increase supervision during passing time in the middle and high schools, to make sure students are not vaping or passing vapes to their classmates. Raven suggested offering incentives to teachers to provide more supervision

during that time. Patty mentioned that teachers/staff should receive a training on what to look for. Perhaps PD hours could be granted to teachers/staff to view a short video or webinar on vaping devices.

4. Alcohol Policy Updates: Wildwood theaters will now be able to increase the hours in which they can sell alcohol and have alcohol in increased theaters. Lark Market will have no restrictions to sell alcohol in their new market. Despite the recommendations by the ALAC, the city council seems to have a less cautious approach to alcohol licensing restrictions.
